

Summer Vacation Studentships / Placements

The following organisations and societies offer funding to enable UK undergraduate students to work in an institutional research lab during summer vacations or offer a summer placement or internship scheme in an industrial or research setting. Also included are some grants / awards for small research projects which can be undertaken at any time of year. Funding amounts and closing dates vary, some require the lab leader or placement supervisor applying for the grant to be members of the society or already in receipt of a grant from the organisation.

Please note the UK Centre for Bioscience is unable to offer funding for summer studentships or placement opportunities for students.

Association for the study of Animal Behaviour Undergraduate Project Scholarships

The scholarships aim to enable undergraduates to undertake supervised research projects, which fall within the field of animal behaviour, lasting from 1 to 8 weeks during academic vacations, in a higher education institution. Undergraduates may also apply for awards for work to be carried out in the vacation immediately following graduation.

Biochemical Society

Applications must be made on behalf of and in association with a named student. Applicants (supervisors) must be members of the Biochemical Society working in a university or research institute. The student applicant would ideally be an undergraduate studying a degree course in biochemistry or a related molecular life science subject. Students will take up the award during the summer vacation before their final year.

Botanical Society of the British Isles Plant Study Grants

Plant Study Grants (PSGs) are given to promote study of British vascular flora by both undergraduate and postgraduate students. They are intended for undergraduates who wish to continue working on botanical projects in the summer vacation prior to their final year and for self-funding postgraduate students to assist with their registration fees where alternative sources of funding are inadequate. PSGs are only open to current BSBI members.

Botanical Society of Scotland Support for Student Fieldwork

Fieldwork projects for which financial support is sought:

- (i) should not form part of a university or college course
- (ii) should be undertaken in the British Isles, preferably in Scotland
- (iii) may be carried out by individual students or groups of students

The maximum grant available for each project is £400.

British Dragonfly Society Grants for Young Odonatists - Philip Corbet Award Fund

The purpose of the fund is to provide some financial support for young people (anyone up to the age of 25) who are engaged in, or wish to establish, a small odonatological research project. The potential research topics are wide-ranging and could involve almost anything that may further biological or ecological knowledge, or support the conservation of British dragonflies.

British Lichen Society Summer Vacation scholarship

The British Lichen Society offers one student scholarship annually for a summer vacation project at a British academic or other research institution. Suitable candidates are likely to be higher education/university students who would like to pursue a project investigating some aspect of lichenology. This could involve, for example, their ecology, taxonomy, physiology, structure, evolution or chemistry, or an area of particular local interest.

British Mycological Society Undergraduate Student Bursaries

The Society offers a number of Undergraduate Student Bursaries to give experience of research in any branch of mycology. The awards will provide support for the student normally for a period of between 4 and 10 weeks in the summer vacation prior to their final year of study. Overheads will not be paid but a sum of up to £250 is available to the host institution as a contribution to consumable costs of the research if funds are not available from other sources.

British Pharmacological Society Vacation Studentships

Aim to encourage consideration of a pharmacology specialism for either school leavers entering a biomedical science degree, or undergraduates studying biomedical science. Each studentship will provide funding to support the living costs of the student while they undertake a summer vacation research project in the host laboratory.

British Phycological Society Summer Undergraduate Research Projects

These aim to give students an opportunity to carry out a research project during the summer vacation. The emphasis is on providing a research experience and training for the student. Summer projects usually last from 6-8 weeks. Applications are made by the project supervisor either for a named student or to enable a student to be sought.

British Society of Animal Science (BSAS) Summer Placement Scheme

The scheme enables companies and institutes to have access to students to help complete specific projects and tasks. Depending upon the individual companies and institutes involved the work available ranges from practical field work or lab studies to computerised data handling of literature reviews and report writing. BSAS help match appropriate companies and students and put them in touch. Placements last for a minimum of 6 weeks.

British Society for Plant Pathology (BSPP) Undergraduate Vacation Bursary Fund

The undergraduate vacation bursary is open to all BSPP members and will provide modest support for work on specified research projects during the summer vacation. The objective of the bursaries is to provide undergraduates considering a research career with some practical experience in a plant pathology laboratory and to assist supervisors to meet some specific research objectives.

Carnegie Scholarships

Undergraduates who were born in Scotland or who have a parent born in Scotland or who have at least two years of secondary education in Scotland, may be considered for the award of a Vacation Scholarship for the pursuit of a full-time research project, usually in the vacation between their second and third years. Scholarships are for maintenance of up to a maximum of eight weeks, whether based at home, elsewhere in the UK, or abroad.

Genetics Society Genes and Development Summer Studentships

The aim of the Genes and Development Summer Studentship scheme is to provide financial support for undergraduate students in any area of genetics, to gain research experience by carrying out a research project in the long vacation, usually prior to their final year. Studentships will only be awarded for students who have yet to complete their first degree i.e. who will still be undergraduates during the long vacation when they do the studentship.

Genesis-Faraday & BSAS (British Society of Animal Science) Vacation Scholarships

BSAS/Genesis Faraday Vacation Scholarship Awards aim to encourage undergraduates into research in the field of farm animal genetics and genomics. Scholarships are available for a minimum of six and a maximum of eight weeks' work. Research Institutes and Universities that are paid up members of Genesis Faraday Partnership can apply to host a Vacation Scholarship. The project must be in the field of Genetics and Genomics as applied to Livestock Breeding and/or Animal Health on one of the farmed terrestrial species or farmed fish.

John Innes Centre Undergraduate Summer Vacation Bursaries

Many labs at JIC welcome undergraduates to work on research projects during the summer vacation. Students typically work in a lab for around 8 weeks during the summer vacation. This provides an excellent opportunity to gain first hand research experience in an internationally respected lab and is particularly useful for undergraduates who may be considering taking up a PhD studentship. The ideal time for this experience is during the summer vacation following the 2nd year of an undergraduate course.
